In addition to numerous public speaking and presentation opportunities, Jennifer works through the Department of Safety training police officers in **emergency en route childbirth**.


Jennifer has been credited for introducing the concept of being prepared for unusually fast childbirth and the health of newborns who've opted for a surprise entrance.
